1. The Purpose

Oral Communications in Japanese for International Researchers (abbreviated as **OCJ**) is particularly designed for international researchers, faculty and staff at Osaka University who wish to acquire some practical Japanese skills to make Japanese acquaintances or friends and make their lives here easier and more enjoyable. The program is intended to help them acquire basic oral Japanese skills that enable them to express themselves in Japanese and ‘have things done effectively’ in their daily lives and in casual situations at the lab. At the same time, it aims to help them build foundation in basic Japanese in terms of structural knowledge of Japanese with which they can further continue studying Japanese.

Particular feature of OCJ is that it does not require participants to learn Japanese scripts, i.e. *hiragana* and *katakana* at the beginning of the course. Though most beginning Japanese courses require you to do so, you can learn oral Japanese skills without any help of these scripts. It is recommended that you learn these scripts after you have acquired certain oral skills in Japanese. Romanized presentation of Japanese is used in OCJ with audio materials available on web.

Another feature of OCJ is that we use English as the medium of instruction, while at the same time a lot of Japanese are used by the teacher and lots of use of Japanese by the participants are encouraged. The course intends to expand your knowledge of Japanese in a rational fashion and also familiarize you with how to mention things and speak Japanese.

*If you are interested in practicing Japanese conversation or learning Japanese scripts and *kanji*, you may join Nihongo Table held once in a week in Suita campus and Toyonaka campus. 2. The Structure

OCJ is a combination of self-study and class practice. Participants are expected to spend some time to study the coursebook with lexical and grammatical annotations and practice with the audio materials before attending the class. Class time are mostly spent for practicing and learning additional useful expressions. Also, participants are expected to write an essay on the topic of the unit after studying each unit.

3. The Materials

Abbreviated Romanized version of “A New Approach to Elementary Japanese, vol 1” (Kuroshio Publisher) is used as the main material of the program. Sound files are available at the publisher’s web site.

4. The Courses

The purpose of OCJ is:

1. to familiarize you with Japanese pronunciations using names of countries, major cities, famous scientists, and loan words (katakana-go)
2. to be able to introduce yourself and talk something about your family
3. to be able to talk about your favorite things (foods, drinks, sports, music, etc.)
4. to be able to describe everyday things and events using simple Japanese
5. to be able to describe what you did in Friday evening, the weekend, etc.
6. to be able to have simple things done in everyday situations
